Operated in collaboration with Black North Initiative, Daniels will provide for rent Work/Live studios to Black-identifying artists and creatives at approximately 50 per cent of the market rate. In collaboration with Toronto-based arts organization Akin Community Projects (Akin), Daniels will provide artists with approximately 2,800 square feet of ground floor retail space at Daniels DuEast Condominiums at a special rate. Daniels and Akin are working closely to provide affordable artist studio and exhibition space, along with community programming and events for artists to support creative endeavors and entrepreneurial undertakings in the community. The space will open in late 2022.

Inspired by the vibrant entrepreneurial spirit in Toronto's Regent Park, later this year Daniels DuEast Condominiums' office component will become home to the Daniels Entrepreneurship Hub — a small business catalyzer aiming to provide workspace for emerging entrepreneurs to grow their businesses. The first organization to utilize this space will be InfiniGuard Security Protections Inc., a social enterprise focused on training at-risk and marginalized youth, aged 18 to 29.
